Program Description: The Fire Technology degree/certificate program prepares students for careers in the fire service, either public or private. After completion of the program, students will have a basic understanding of fire protection, prevention and behavior, fire company organization and procedures, fire hydraulics, wildlandfire behavior and fire investigation among other areas. HLHSCI 151 (EMT) may be waived; however, 2 additional Fire Tech courses must be taken in lieu of HLHSCI 151.

Program Learning Outcome: Demonstrate proficiency in the core skills and knowledge of fire organization, fire prevention, fire equipment and systems, building construction for fire protection, fire behavior and combustion, and emergency medical technician.
