

Basic Proficiency in Chinese - Certificate of Specialization

Program Description: The program prepares students for communicating in Chinese through the four skills: reading, writing, listening, and speaking at the basic (high novice) level per the American Council of Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) guidelines. This certificate will also provide fundamental cultural knowledge following the 3Ps (Products, Practices and Perspectives) cultural framework.

Program SLO: Communicate through reading, writing, speaking and listening in Chinese at the novice high level as indicated by the ACTFL guidelines. Demonstrate fundamental knowledge of the culture of the Chinese language.
