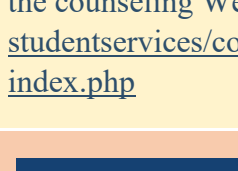

The Learning Center (TLC) is a FREE tutoring resource for current COC students seeking assistance in Mathematics, English/

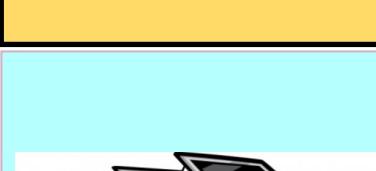


Writing, Computer Science, and other select courses. No appointment is necessary. COC Student ID is required. In addition, TLC provides:

Food Service Update

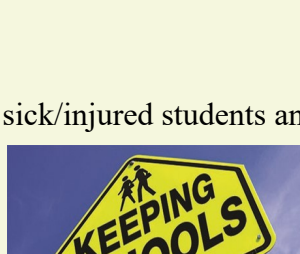


You'll probably notice that our Canyons Café has closed as part of an exciting project to relocate our services up to room 303. The "new" Canyons Café is expected to open mid-to late Fall semester. In the interim, the vending machines will still be available, moving to room 302 when construction begins in 303. In addition, we will pilot something new at the CCC - food trucks rotating to the Campus! Stay tuned for days/hours as we finalize details with the trucks.

Message from Campus Safety

Important tips for students:

1. Eat and hydrate before class(s). Campus Safety responds to numerous calls of sick/injured students and the number one culprit is low blood sugar and dehydration.
2. First week, allowing enough time to arrive before class(s) to find parking space, as it is crowded and we are a ONE way roadway.
3. Speaking of ONE Way, please follow marked traffic signs and controls and don't drive the wrong way. The speed limits are between 5 and 15MPH as there are numerous curves, speed bumps, and pedestrians. Stop for pedestrians in crosswalks, it's the law.
4. For those students that are being dropped off (not driving themselves) there is a pick up/drop off at the top of the Campus (white curb/signs posted) horseshoe. Alternatively, students can be dropped off in any student parking lot, and easily walk to their class from there. Parents and other drivers should not stop in roadways or red curbs, as it is against the law and they will be cited. It also creates a traffic/safety hazard for them, as well as other students.
5. Parking passes can be purchased online via the COC website (recommended) or day passes can be purchased in student lots 1, 2 and 3 at the black parking machines. From time to time, these machines may be out of order, and if so, the only vehicles that will be cited are those that park illegally such as in staff, handicapped or non-student designated spaces/lots. Students who choose not to buy a semester parking pass, and fail to check machines (to see if they are working) run the risk of being cited for no pass.
6. Recap: Most important - hydration, drive safe, and make your college experience a great one.
