THE APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

It is important to refer to the nursing website for all deadlines and application instructions! A background check will be completed after an invitation for admission into the nursing program is received.

3.	APPLICATION SUBMISSION	If eligible, submit the online Nursing Program Application available on the nursing website and all required supporting documents. Applicants who submit incomplete applications or who are missing any required documents will automatically be ineligible.				
4.	SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY	 Upon receipt of application, a scholastic eligibility will be determined through the California Community College Chancellor's Office approved formula which calculates the student's probability of successfully completing the ADN program. The formula uses the following criteria: Core Biology GPA – all Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology courses taken at the college level. Core Biology Repetitions – the number of times a student has repeated a Core Biology course (for previous grades of D, F, FW, or W). English GPA – all credit English course grades regardless of the level of the course. Overall GPA – For all courses from <u>every</u> college attended as it appears on college transcripts (includes non-degree applicable)
